

Angelina Jolie uses the Dermaroller

We've cleared up the has-she-or-hasn't-she conundrum; turns out Angelina's Cannes complexion wasn't down to surgery but a bizarre new treatment



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IT WAS THE FIRST TIME WE HAD SEEN

ANGELINA Jolie glammed up since she appeared at the Oscars back in February. As she strode down the red carpet in Cannes for the premiere of *Inglourious Basterds*, Versace dress slashed to the thigh, Angelina faced the world – and Jennifer Aniston – amid speculation that she and Brad Pitt are on the verge of splitting. However, as Cannes drew to a close, it wasn't just the state of their relationship that everyone was talking about – it was also the altered state of her face. Now *Grazia* can exclusively reveal that Angelina's strangely dewy complexion isn't down to surgery, but a pioneering treatment called the 'Dermaroller'. With more than a passing resemblance to a medieval torture implement, the Dermaroller is covered with hundreds of tiny needles which are applied to the face to deliberately cause pores to bleed. The often painful treatment, which costs up to £445 per session, leaves tiny pin-pricks in the skin, forcing the body to produce extra collagen to repair them – and it's that healing process which apparently gives users a super-glow.

'Angelina wanted to pull out all the stops,' said a source. 'She knew all eyes would be on her. She's been using the Dermaroller on and off for six months, as she wants to avoid plastic surgery,' our source added.

Dr Michael Prager, from the Prager Clinic in London, says that, despite its scary appearance, the Dermaroller does leave skin looking incredibly smooth. He added, 'Angelina's skin has the kind of plumpness you see in patients who use the treatment.'
